Projects, Projects, Projects!

The roof project moves ever forward – and considering the ever higher cost of materials, a good thing at that! There are (as of the writing of this newsletter) 9 roofs remaining – it looks like everything may be done by the end of 2022. By completing this project, the Association should not have to worry about replacing the roofs for at least forty years (or until 2062!)

In the vein of continuing to make the community better, several homeowners have voiced concerns of getting positive lead tests due to the exterior of the building. The Board agreed to have the exterior portions of the building painted to ensure the safety of all the residents, as well as helping make the buildings look refreshed to match the

new roofs. There are approximately 26 buildings remaining.

After this, the Board will turn its sights on the concrete throughout the property to ensure the sidewalks are smooth and trip hazard free.

Latest Resolution (Phase Boards)

As you may know, at the 2022 Annual Meeting, many homeowners joined the Phase Boards (I, II and M). While the Board Members for the Community Service Association, the 'master' Association, will still govern and make decisions for Maryland Farms, we would like to welcome all those who were elected. The reason for the resolution which was mailed to all owners was to ensure that the duties for each Board were made clear and to ensure that the Board Meetings, which can already run long, remain as streamlined as possible. Helping Hands

<u>Limited/Common Elements versus</u> <u>Homeowner Responsibility</u>

No matter how hard we try, there will come a time when something breaks – the question is, who is responsible when it comes to a Condominium. The simple rule of thumb is that if something (a wire, pipe, tube, appliance, et al) only serves one home, then they are responsible for maintaining and repairing said item, as well as any subsequent damages it may have caused (such as a broken pipe leaking water). If a pipe serves more than one unit (such as the larger pipes which bring water up through the building), then that pipe would be the Association's responsibility to repair, and any damages would be fixed by Maryland Farms. Sometimes it can be hard to be certain, as pipes branch off and disappear behind drywall. If you are ever unsure, please contact the Site Office immediately. Any pipe, electrical, or other repairs within your own

home should be done by a licensed and bonded contractor – this will not only protect you, but all of your neighbors should something go awry.

When it comes to the exterior of the building, this is the responsibility of the Association. The windows and doors fall to homeowners, so if you are looking to upgrade your windows or sliding glass door, please remember that any change to the look of the building have to be approved by the Board.
